Open Public Space, Housing, and Public Safety

1. Support E-motorcycle and E-bike regulation(s) that are more clear and concise for today's environment
2. Support efforts to limit release of data and images collected by automated license plate readers (ALPR) and other public safety camera systems to protect privacy
3. Support policy changes that will lower indigent defense costs and court fees
4. Support opportunities to make it easier to encourage building a diversity of housing types for home ownership, including condo liability reform
5. Roof replacements of City park shelters and buildings at \$75k

Public Works Equipment

1. Street sweeper at \$400k
2. Vactor truck at \$500k

Streets and Stormwater Improvements

1. Stormwater catch basin repair & replacement at \$4 million
2. City-wide sidewalk repair and replacement at \$1.3 million
3. Public Works property acquisition at \$3.5 million
4. Silver Crest Drive sidewalks and stormwater project at \$5 million
5. Trillium Boulevard road and sidewalk improvements at \$6.9 million
